

Minutes of (virtual) meeting held on 24th June 2020.

Present: Mr. D. Mortimer, Mr. R. Martin, Mr. J. Armstrong, Mr. P. Gorbng, Mr. M. Herridge, Mrs. K. Hinchley, Mrs. C. MacDonald, Mrs. P. Cumming and two members of the public – Mr. A. Whiteley and Mr. A. Johnson,

3/20:1: Apologies for absence: none.

3/20:2: Declaration of interest: none.

3/20:3: Minutes of (virtual) meeting held on 13th May were agreed and accepted as a true record.

3/20:4: PARISH PLAN KEY ISSUES:

A) Roads / Speed:

- i) Potholes: Mr. Armstrong advised that resurfacing etc. had now been completed in Weatherlane. He requested gullies be emptied (the clerk to request all gullies in the parish be attended to at the soonest opportunity). All potholes continue to be chased for repair, in particular Church Lane and Dark Lane.
- ii) Redhouse Lane: Mrs. Hinchley advised of the various problems in Redhouse Lane – it was understood that long overdue resurfacing would commence in the coming week and the ongoing water flowing down The Beak would finally be rectified.
- iii) A 451 Dunley – there was continuing concern with regard to the volume and speed of traffic through Dunley on the A451. Discussion had taken place with the police and highways authority, and suggestions raised with regard to speed enforcement but nothing further to report at the present time.

B) Communication:

- i) County Council – report forwarded from Mr. Phil Grove and circulated to all councillors. There were no matters arising.

C) District Council: Mrs. Cumming reported on the various virtual meetings held by the District Council including discussion on the SWDP and local issues and concerns, and the recent purchase by the district council of land at Hallow to help climate change. Mrs. Cumming advised, as requested, various matters with regard to this parish had been taken up with Enforcement.

D) Enforcement:

- i) Shavers End: There was considerable discussion with regard to the ongoing issues at Shavers End - drug abuse, illegal parking, trespassing, litter etc. It was again confirmed that the Parish Council would support the owner should a further planning application be forthcoming. Further update now awaited in particular from Highways and the Police on the way forward. Thanks were given to Mrs. Cumming and to Mr. Alan Johnson.
